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The Vulnerability Index – Service Prioritisation Decision Assistance Tool (VI-SPDAT)

- Merges the Vulnerability Index with the SPDAT prescreen tool
- Assess the needs of individuals and families experiencing homelessness
- Identifies which individuals and families are of highest priority
- Has been tested and proven to be both:
 - valid (the tool measures what it claims to measure)
 - reliable (the results of the assessment are consistent)





The Individuals Service Prioritisation Decision Assistance Tool – **SPDAT**

- Respondents with scores of 0-4 who are homeless exit homelessness on their own
- Respondents with scores of 5-9 need brief and shallow support
- Respondents with scores of 10 or more need permanent assistance with housing and support services
- We can determine who is who






The Families Service Prioritisation Decision Assistance Tool – **SPDAT**

- Respondents with scores of 6-11 need brief and shallow support
- Respondents with scores of 12 or more need permanent assistance with housing and support services


Geographic Reach





- 267 families surveyed
- 537 children in families
- Average age of heads of household was 32.5 years
- Average age of the children was 7 years
- Youngest child was 1 month old












Over 55 years and older overview

- 93 out of 961 (9.7%) of individuals and head of households were over the age of 55 years
- 17 (18.3%) were female and 76 (81.7%) were male
- 16 out of that 93 (17.2%) require permanent support and affordable housing
- 49 out of that 93 (52.7%) require short-term support and affordable housing
- 28 out of that 93 (30.1%) require only affordable housing










Income - Families

Length of time homeless and average age






- 240 (25%) of people (n=961) reported history of foster care or institutional care as a child




- experienced emotional, physical, psychological, sexual or other type of abuse or trauma;






Temporary Accom (n=31)






